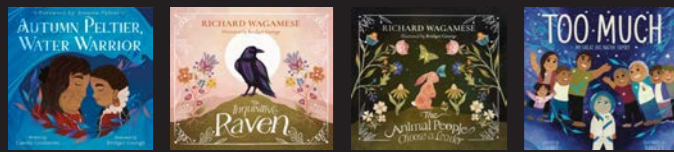




Bridget George
